Frames, with metal corners, any dimensions, each, 6 cents. Sample frames, by mail, with section of metal rabbet, 15 cents. Metal corners, put up in packages of 100, \$1.00. As four corners are required for each frame, the above package is sufficient for 25 frames only. Common frames may be used in the Simplicity Hive, or metal corner frames may be used in common hives, but considerable care is required to avoid cutting bees in two, but with the metal corners and metal rabbets it is almost impossible to injure a bee, no matter how rapidly the combs are handled, and as they are never gummed fast, we can work with one in each hand.

Simplicity Hive, cut ready to nail, including nails, hinges, metal rabbets, etc., 90 cents. Two of the hives constitute a two-story hive, and then one of the covers forms a bottom board to both. No bottom accompanies a single story. By a recent improvement, any cover is hinged instantly on any hive, and is unhinged as quickly.

Cloth quilts, each, 25 cents. These are made of a very fine, soft batting, and may be pressed down on the frames when covered with bees, without any fear of hurting them. Quilts are almost a necessity with metal corner frames, for, with a honey board, there is a tendency for the frames to lift out of the hive when it is raised up.

Honey Extractors, for any sized frame, \$10.00. These frames were built under the direct supervision of both Novice and P. G., and are light, strong, easy running, and durable. The pivots are all of the finest tempered steel. The case being stationary, no strength is required to turn it more than is really necessary to bring the comb itself up to the proper speed.

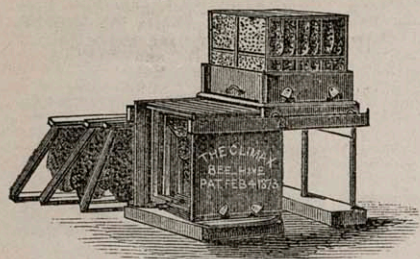

The Climax Bee-Hive.



The leading features of this hive are:

1. Its upright form, which economizes the heat generated by the bees.
2. It is made in two parts. The upper part, which contains the boxes (or frames), is provided with common trunk rollers, and rests on cleats, secured to the lower part of the hive. These cleats extend far enough beyond the hive to allow the upper part to roll off from the lower without crushing, disturbing or in any way interfering with the labor of the bees. The strips forming the track, have drop-legs at their outer ends, and are hinged just outside the body of the hive (Fig. 1); and when not in use, fold up snugly against the hive (Fig. 2).
