The University of Wisconsin, one of the world's leading institutions of higher education, is dedicated to the support of academic freedom.

Established in 1848, today the University of Wisconsin-Madison includes 13 schools and colleges, 133 academic departments, more than 43,000 students and 14,000 employees, nearly 4,000,000 volumes in 22 libraries, a \$750,000,000 budget, and research and development expenditures totaling \$185,000,000 (third largest in the U.S.).

Wisconsin has ranked among the top 10 universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910. Combining the results of seven major ratings since 1925, Prof. David Webster of the University of Pennsylvania, writing for the June 1983 Change magazine, ranked the University of Wisconsin-Madison fourth in the nation—behind Harvard, California-Berkeley and Yale, and tied with the University of Chicago. More than 4,100 courses and 12,600 sections were offered in the fall of 1987. Majors are available in 151 bachelor's, 191 master's, and 123 doctor's degree programs.

UW-Madison departments ranked among the top ten in the nation in the 1983 "Assessment of Research-Doctorate Programs in the United States" include Sociology (1st), German, Chemical Engineering and Geography (2nd), Statistics (4th), Plant Pathology, Molecular Biology and Biochemistry (5th), Spanish and Portuguese (6th), Zoology (7th), Political Science, Chemistry and Economics (8th), Mathematics (9th), and History (10th).

More than 400 campus organizations offer a wide variety of activities for Wisconsin students—including social, political, philosophic or religious, sports, honorary, ecological, philanthropic, drama and music groups plus fraternities and sororities. Film societies show 400 titles a year, and the intramural recreation program services some 35,000 students and staff at five indoor recreational facilities every month.

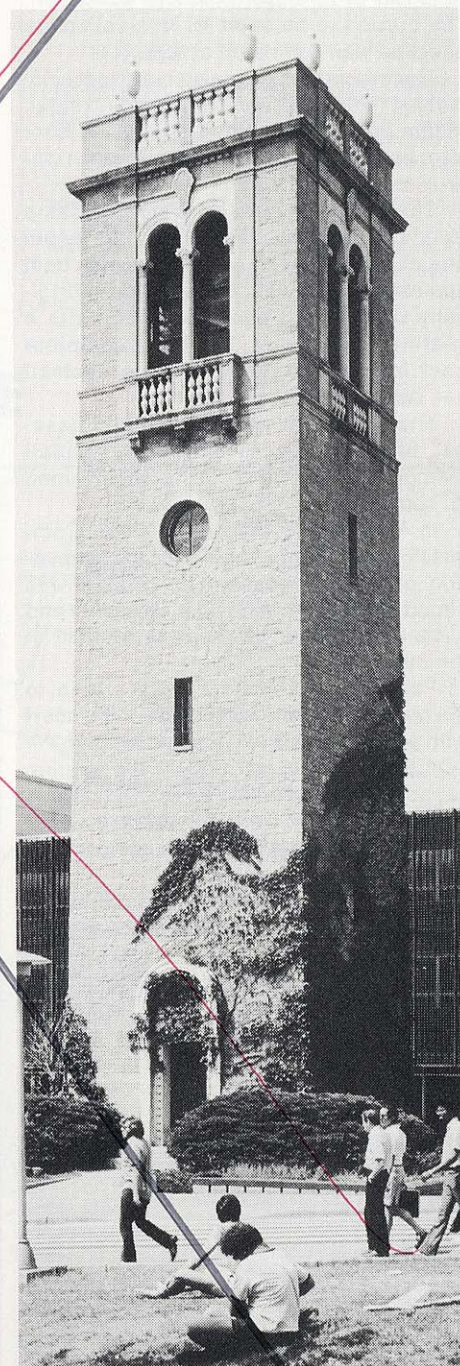
Situated amidst five fresh-water lakes and rolling hills, the Madison campus is one of the most enchanting in America. It sits on the south shore of Lake Mendota, encompassing more than 300 buildings and 900 acres of land—most within two blocks of the lake. There is beautiful and green Bascom Hill and a 129-acre peninsula—complete with hiking trails—known as Picnic Point. There is the vibrant pedestrian State Street Mall—lined with unique shops and restaurants. There also is the on-the-hour ringing bells of Carillon Tower and 76,293-seat Camp Randall Stadium.

The Elvehjem Museum of Art houses the University's collection of more than 10,000 paintings, prints, drawings, sculpture, and decorative arts dating from 2300

B.C. to the present, and maintains an active schedule of temporary exhibits.

The University's intercollegiate athletic program includes men's competition in football, basketball, ice hockey, track and field, cross country, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, rowing, wrestling, baseball, golf, gymnastics and fencing.

The University of Wisconsin Fieldhouse is the home of the basketball Badgers. The UW Fieldhouse was a project of then Athletic Director George Little when he arrived at Wisconsin in 1925. In 1930, it became a reality.

In 1927, Little proposed to the athletic council and regents the plan under which the fieldhouse was to be constructed. This proposal met the approval of the board after two previous attempts had failed.

The original layout included a \$650,000 building to house both an indoor training facility for intercollegiate teams and the required program of physical education. The portion to be used for intercollegiate athletics was estimated at \$385,000.

The intercollegiate portion of the facility housed the men's and women's basketball teams and the wrestling squad. Its construction, completed in 1931, cost an approximately \$434,000.

The structure remains a part of Camp Randall Stadium, standing on the south end of the field, with concrete stands built against its north wall. The fieldhouse originally contained a basketball floor with a seating capacity of 12,000, a complete track facility, and room for indoor football and baseball training.

The football, track and field and baseball teams moved to the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center, "the Shell", upon its completion in 1956.

In April of 1976, the state Building Commission approved \$718,000 for the renovation of the fieldhouse. The project was aimed at improving the seating facility and allowing for other activities to be held in the building.

Permanent bleachers were added to the north, south and west sides of the court with portable seats and a stage area on the east side. This effort brought the seating capacity to 11,895. New locker rooms and a training facility were constructed under the west side seats and the existing locker rooms were renovated.

A new lighting system was added in 1977 along with an improved sound system.

The UW Fieldhouse is also the site of the WIAA boys' and girls' state basketball tournaments, the WIAA state wrestling tournaments, Big Ten Championship gymnastics' meets, live music concerts and numerous other events.



WISCONSIN HOME BASKETBALL ATTENDANCE SINCE 1940-41

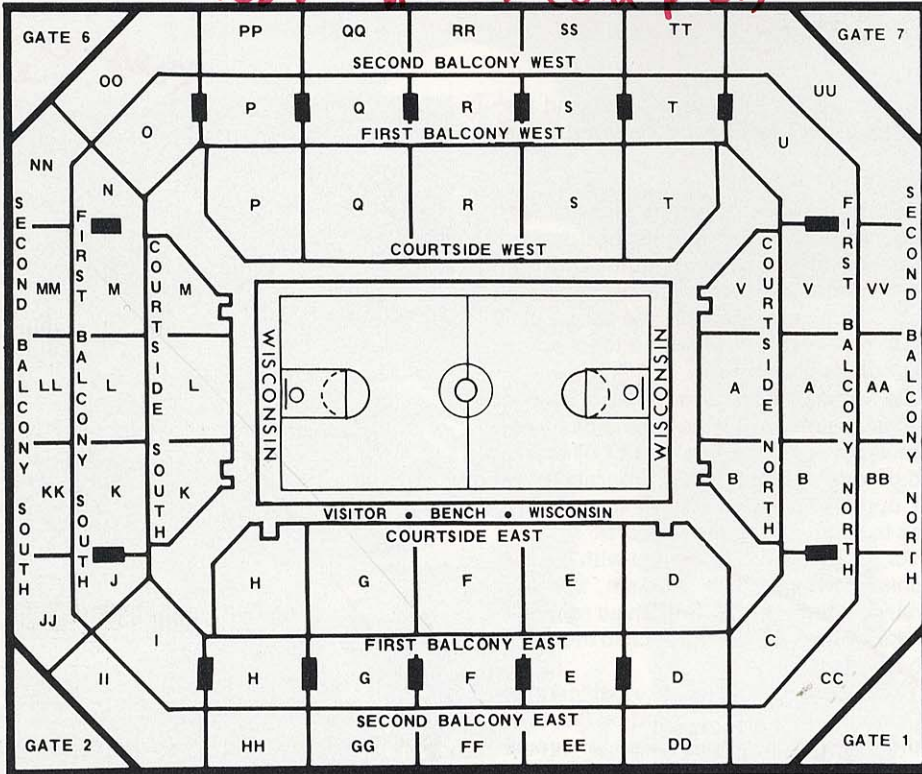

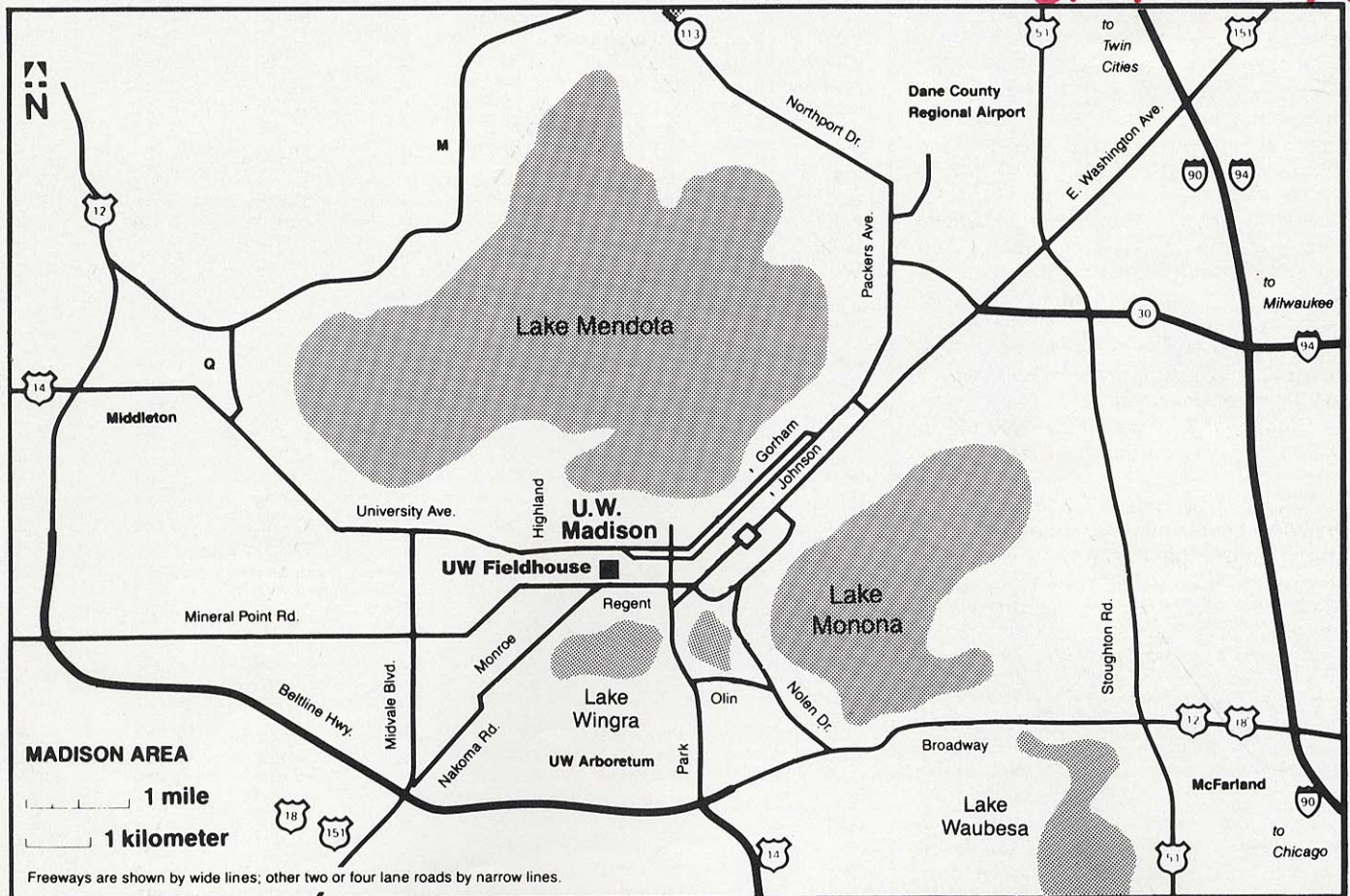

At courtside during all University of Wisconsin basketball games is a valuable tool which has aided the development of the men's program. The FINAL III basketball statistics program has been in use since the 1986-87 season. The system — which was purchased by the Badger Basketball Boosters and donated to the University — has proved invaluable for the coaches, sports information departments and the media.

Using light pens, and shot and information screens, statistics are "penned" in as the game progresses. The data collected — shots made and missed, rebounds, turnovers, assists, steals, fouls, etc. — is automatically computed for the final box score.

But the system's forte is in the analyses it performs. It provides in-depth coaching analyses such as player combination effectiveness, turnover analyses, shot analyses by distance and angle, etc. Input via game film also provides opportunities to scout prospective opponents and perform post-game analyses of away games.

During game time, Final III provides accumulation and analyses of data.

Coaches, sports information staff and the media can access the system during game time.

The Final III system also provides complete player and team history files and formats this information into several forms, including direct telecommunication to news outlets. The system immediately updates single game, season and career statistics for the players and the team while the game is in progress.

Two other functions have also been a welcome addition to the basketball program — a coaching analysis of offensive and defensive plays, and a program to input opponents' information from game films to produce scouting reports.

As the only Big Ten school with such a sophisticated statistics program, the University of Wisconsin has received recognition for its innovative approach to the sport of basketball.

Computers can't win basketball games, but the information processed by this program should help provide Badger teams with the state-of-the-art information they need for improvement and a winning edge.

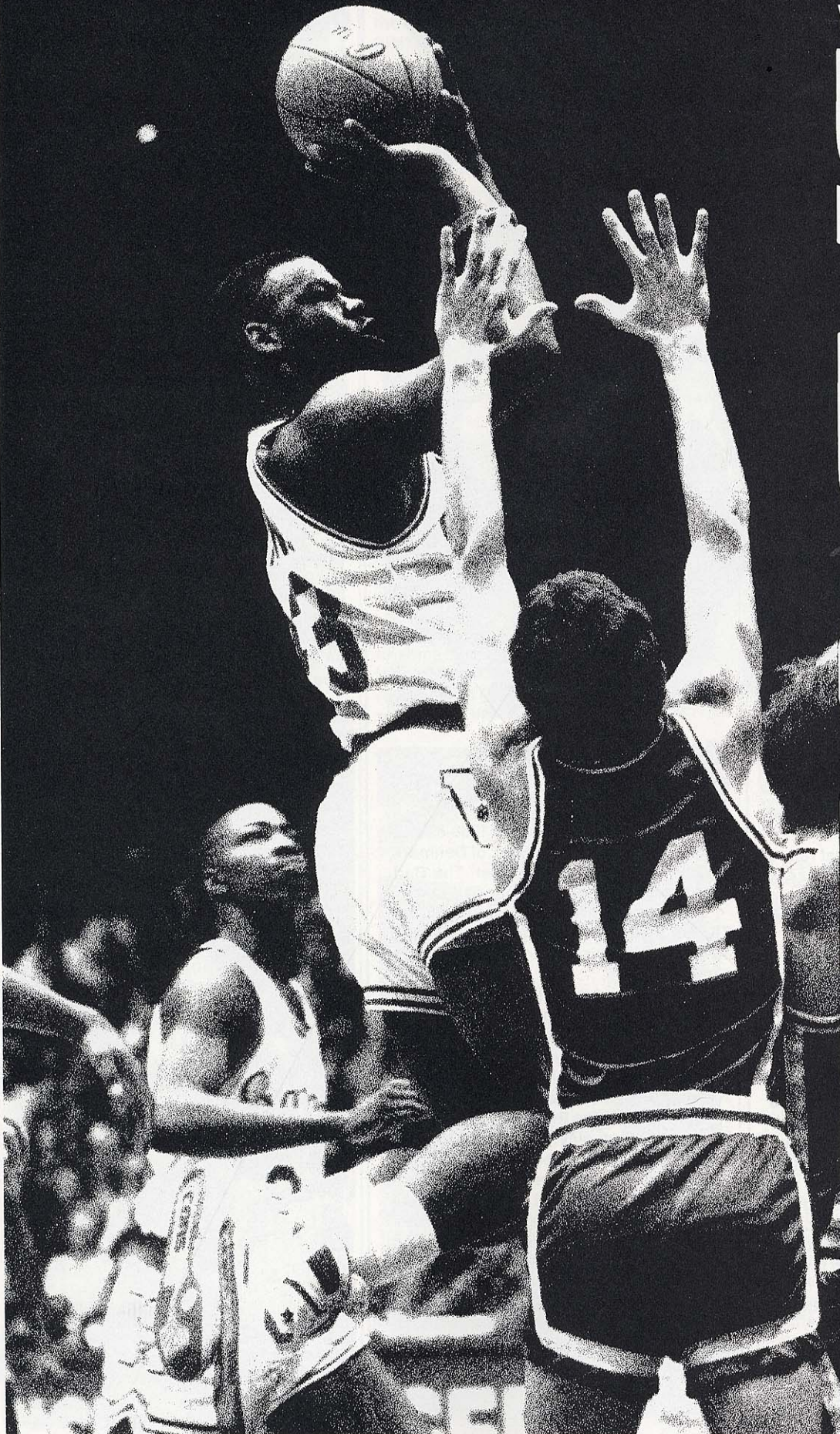

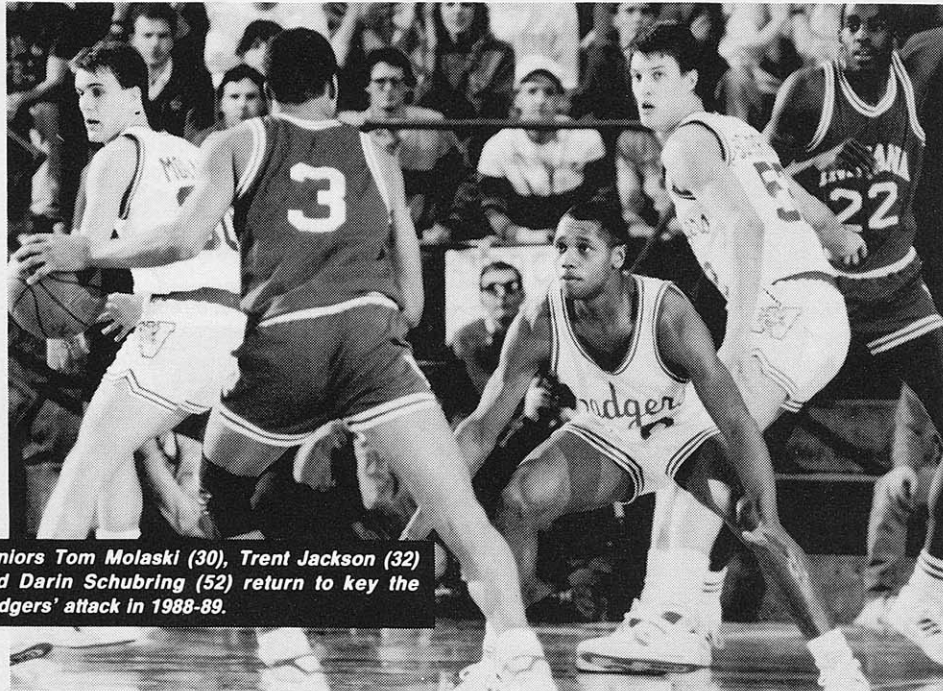

Finish among the league's top five and a trip to the NCAA post-season tournament is usually assured.

For the first time since Steve Yoder took over a struggling basketball program in 1982, Wisconsin is in a position to compete against the best the Big Ten has to offer. That usually means competing against teams that are national title contenders.

With 10 returning letterwinners, including all five starters, the Badgers' have the potential to finish in the first division of the Big Ten. If they accomplish that goal, Wisconsin could make a long overdue appearance in post-season play.

"We've finally got overall depth and a team that has the potential to be successful," Yoder said. "We are in a position to make some positive things happen for this program."

Yet, Yoder realizes what the Badgers are up against.

"The rest of the Big Ten has improved," Yoder said. "The reputation of the conference won't suffer this season. We have a lot of work to do to get a shot at the first division."

EUROPEAN TRIP PROVIDES A BOOST

Wisconsin prepared for the 1988-89 season by taking a two-week tour of Denmark, Finland and Sweden in August. The Badgers posted an 8-0 mark during the trip.

The Badgers' "dynamic duo" of guard **TRENT JACKSON** and forward **DANNY JONES** made their presence felt during the summer tour.

Jones gave future foes something to think about in the Badgers' final game. He scored 53 points to lead the UW to a 120-118 victory over Taby of Sodertalje, Sweden's national champion.

Yoder says the successful tour could be the springboard the Badgers need to vault into post-season play.

"The tour was a great learning experience for us as well as a great life experience," Yoder said. "But we need to take that experience and use it to our advantage when our regular season begins in November."

The one-two punch of Jackson and Jones provide the Badgers with one of their top scoring duos in school history.

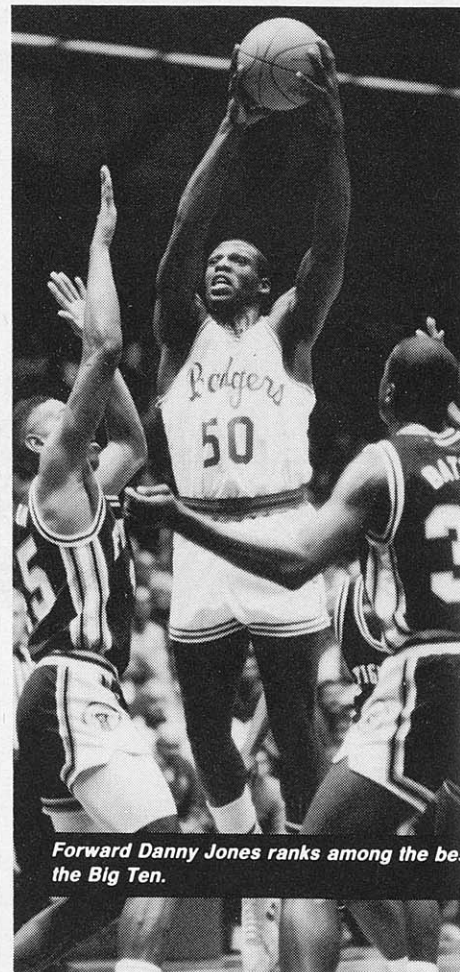
Street & Smith's Magazine selected the pair for its 1988-89 Pre-season Honorable Mention All-America team. The duo was responsible for 52 percent of the Badgers' scoring last season. Jackson was third (19.3 ppg) and Jones placed fifth (18.6) in the Big Ten scoring race.

Thanks to the emergence of the high-scoring duo, Wisconsin finished in undisputed possession of seventh place last season. It was the highest finish by a Wisconsin squad since the 1973-74 season.

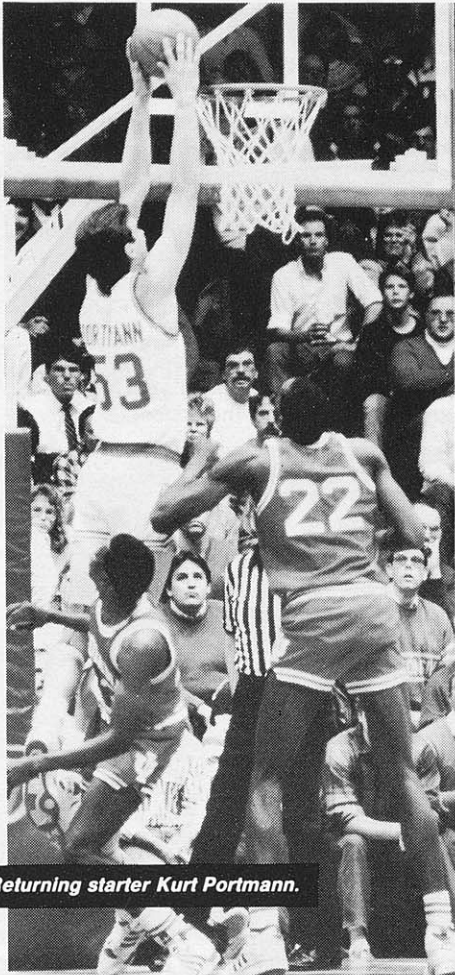
The team's "Most Valuable Player," Jackson led Wisconsin in nine categories and also set a UW single-season record with 59 steals. He ranks 19th on the UW all-time scoring list with 971 points.

Jones earned the team's "Most Improved" award. He was second in scoring and led the Badgers in rebounding. He set UW single-season field goal shooting records in all games (.570) and in Big Ten-only games (.571).

"In Jackson and Jones, we have two proven, Big Ten calibre players who can score," Yoder said. "But we need someone else to emerge as a consistent scoring threat."

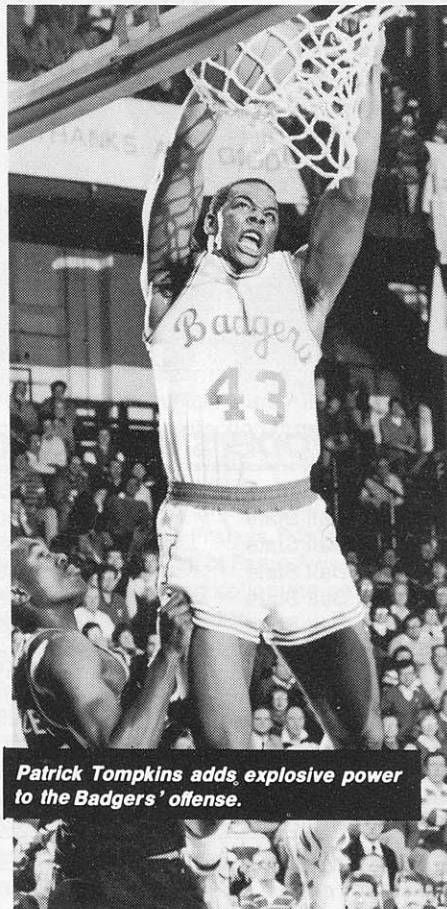

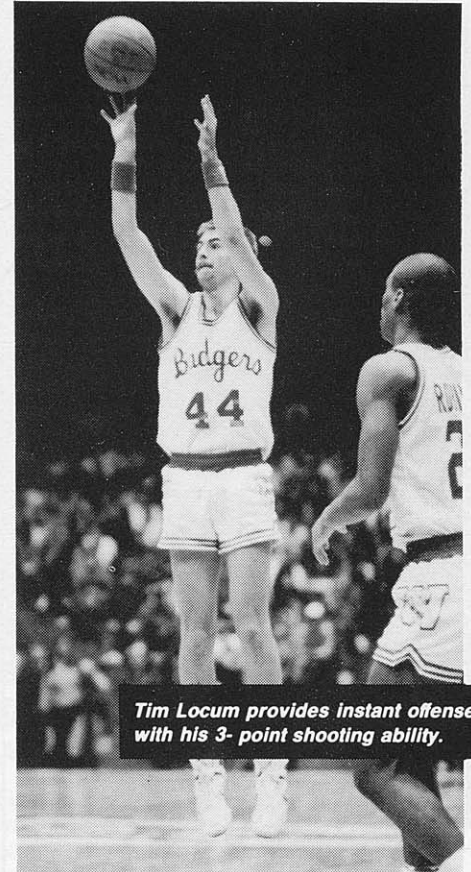

BADGERS FOCUS ON TOUGH CHALLENGE

The last time Wisconsin traveled overseas was before the 1984-85 season. The Badgers went 14-14 during the season, the best record by a Wisconsin team since the 1979-80 squad posted a 15-14 record.

Yoder said the trip was worthwhile for two reasons.

"We learned that we have more depth that at any time in my six years at Wisconsin. The trip also showed our players that Jones needs to get the ball in his hands as much as possible."

Wisconsin opened its 1988-89 pre-season with a midnight practice session. The early approach signaled that this season's Badgers mean business.

"We know we have a tough job to accomplish," Yoder said. "If we are to break into the Big Ten's top five, we have to start beating the teams in front of us."

If they are successful, the Badgers could be tournament bound when March madness arrives.

HEAD COACH STEVE YODER



The University of Wisconsin basketball program is safely in the hands of its seventh-year head coach Steve Yoder. The program has shown gradual improvement during Yoder's tenure. Yoder is respected for his bench coaching and his ability to field tough, competitive teams.

The 49-year-old Yoder joined the Badgers in 1982. Since taking the helm at Wisconsin, he has been a central figure in the Wisconsin basketball program turnaround. With 10 returning letterwinners, including five starters, Yoder is expected to field his most competitive team at Wisconsin this season.

He came to Madison from Ball State University after he compiled a five-year record of 77-62 as head coach. He was named the Mid-American Conference "Coach-of-the-Year" for both the 1980-81 and 1981-82 seasons. The 1980-81 Ball State team shared the Mid-American Conference title with three other schools and gained an NCAA tournament berth by winning the conference's post-season tournament.

Ball State compiled an overall 17-11 record during the 1981-82 season, including a 12-4 conference record that gave them the MAC championship. The

Cardinals lost to Northern Illinois 79-75 in overtime in the MAC post-season tournament title game.

A native of Plymouth, Indiana, Yoder is a 1958 graduate of Plymouth High School. He attended Illinois Wesleyan University on a basketball and baseball scholarship, winning four letters in baseball and two in basketball before graduating in 1962. He received his master's degree from St. Francis College in Fort Wayne, Indiana in 1970.

He began his coaching career at Glen Ellyn, Illinois, Junior High School and in 1965 took an assistant's position at Plymouth, Indiana.

Yoder became head coach at Plymouth High School in 1967 and proceeded to guide the school to three conference titles, three sectional crowns, a pair of regional titles, and two finishes among the top ten teams in state rankings over a six year period.

Steve was named Indiana's District One "Coach-of-the-Year" in 1973 and then accepted a job as assistant coach at Furman University. He returned to Indiana in 1975 as head coach at Mishawaka's Penn High School.

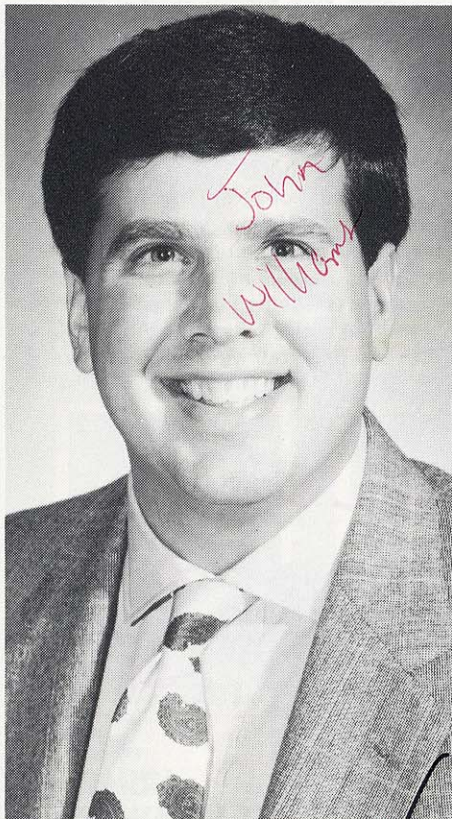
In 1976, he became assistant basketball coach at Ball State and a year later became head coach at the school.

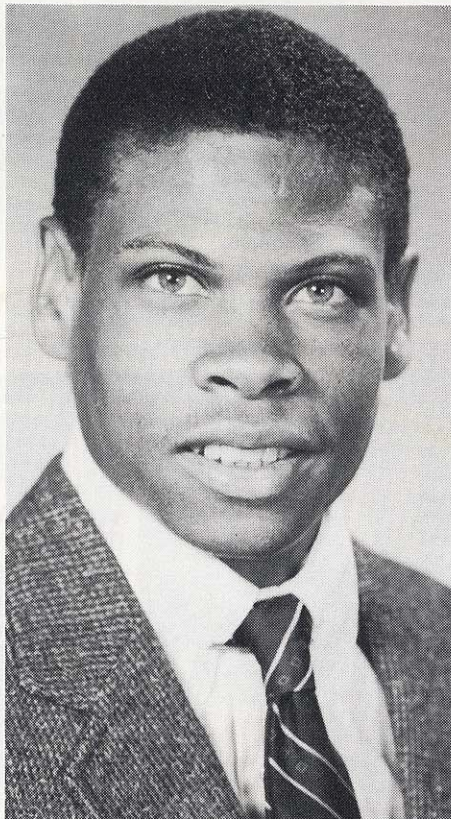

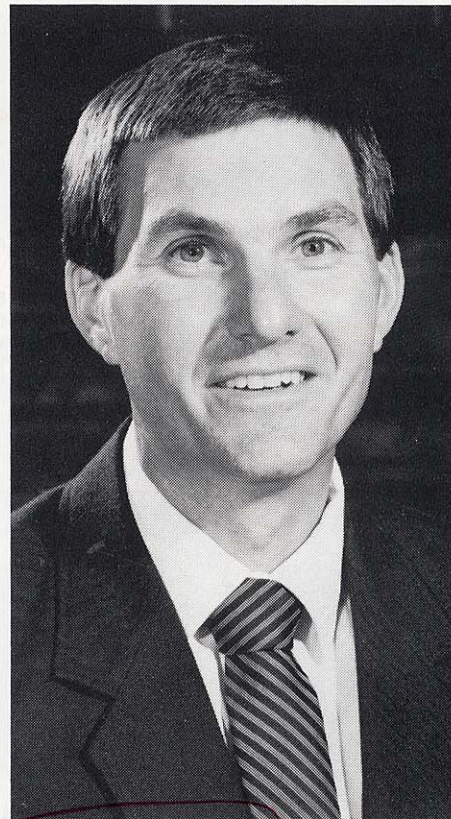

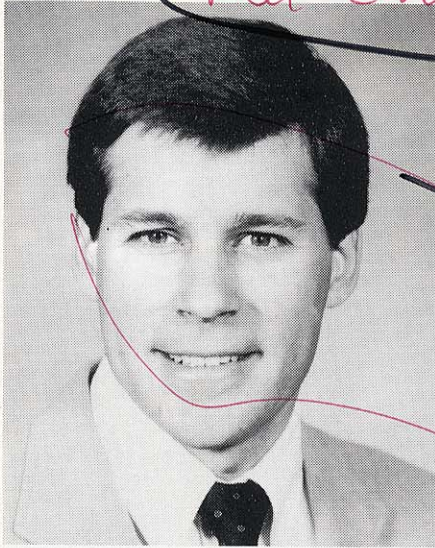
Rod began his coaching career at Prairie du Chien High School in 1969.

THE STRENGTH PROGRAM

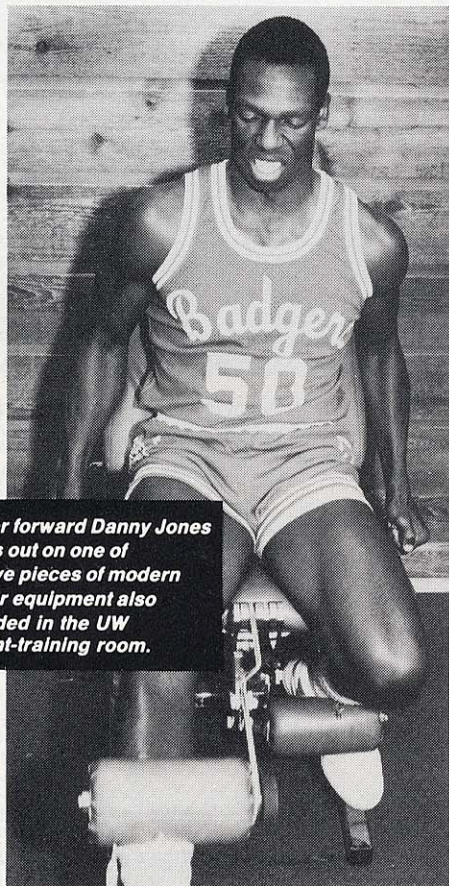

At the University of Wisconsin, the "physical fitness" of student-athletes is of primary concern.

Under the guidance of Ken Ellett and Jim Hyne, the UW strength program is recognized as one of the most successful and complete in the Big Ten.

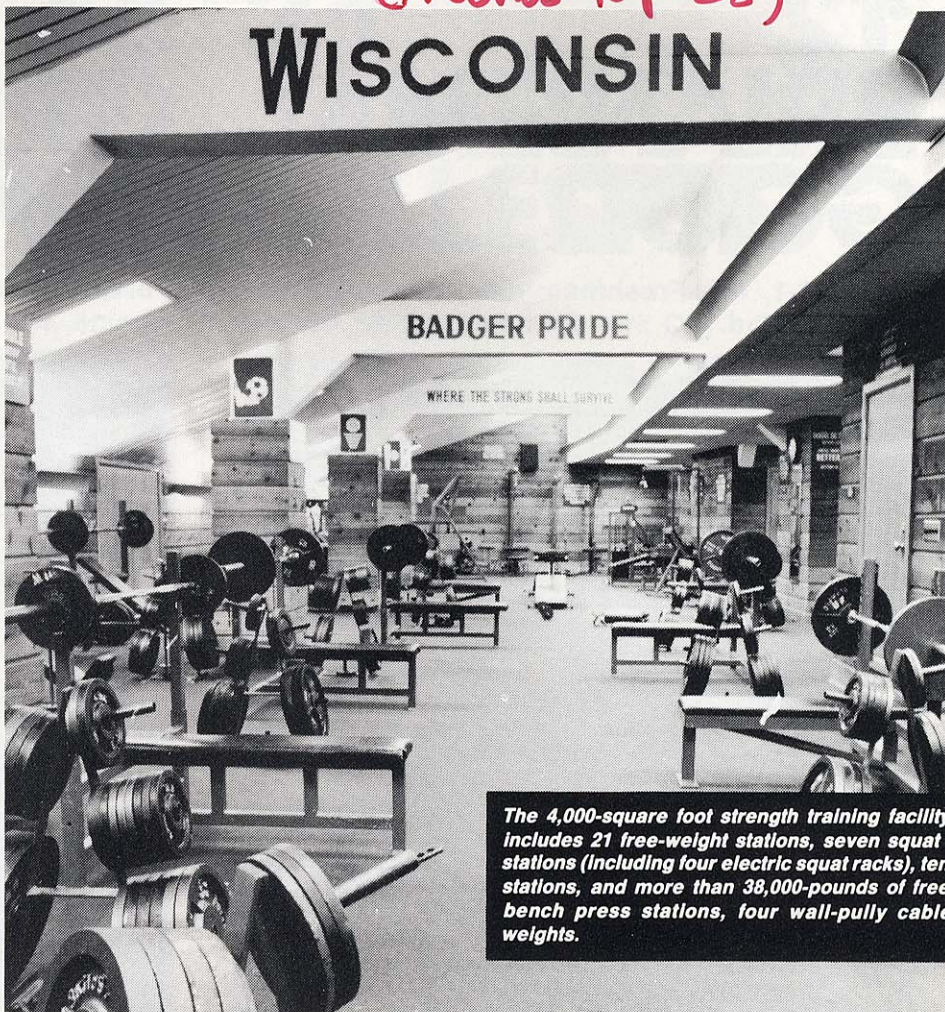
"We use input from the coaching staff, basketball trainer and strength coach to build a complete conditioning and weight training program," Hyne said. "As a group we discuss what the basketball program needs to become more successful. We then structure a program for the entire team that still has the flexibility to be specialized to an individual player's needs."

Strength training at Wisconsin consists of several year-round programs. In basketball, the strength program includes a pre-season conditioning and weight training program, an in-season maintenance program, as well as Spring and Summer programs. The basketball team normally uses the strength training facility two hours per day, three days per week.

Each sport that utilizes the weight room is fully supervised by Hyne and his staff. They will analyze and chart an individual athlete's week-by-week progress, as well as plan individual and team conditioning programs for the school's men's and women's sports. Strength training at the University of Wisconsin means more than

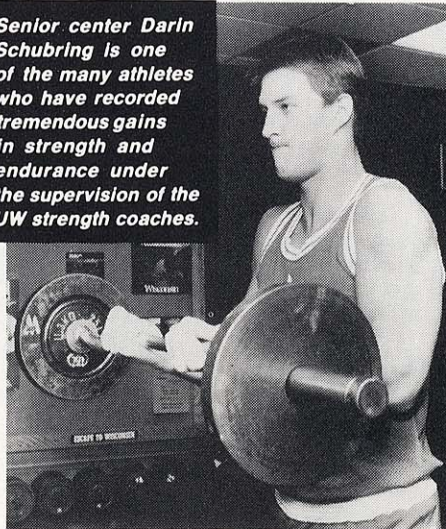

just weight lifting. It also includes agility and flexibility development.

"The key to our program is the backing of the coaching staff," Hyne said. "They realize that our aim isn't to build a team of weightlifters. We want a team of basketball players who can be the best that they can

Senior center Darin Schubring is one of the many athletes who have recorded tremendous gains in strength and endurance under the supervision of the UW strength coaches.



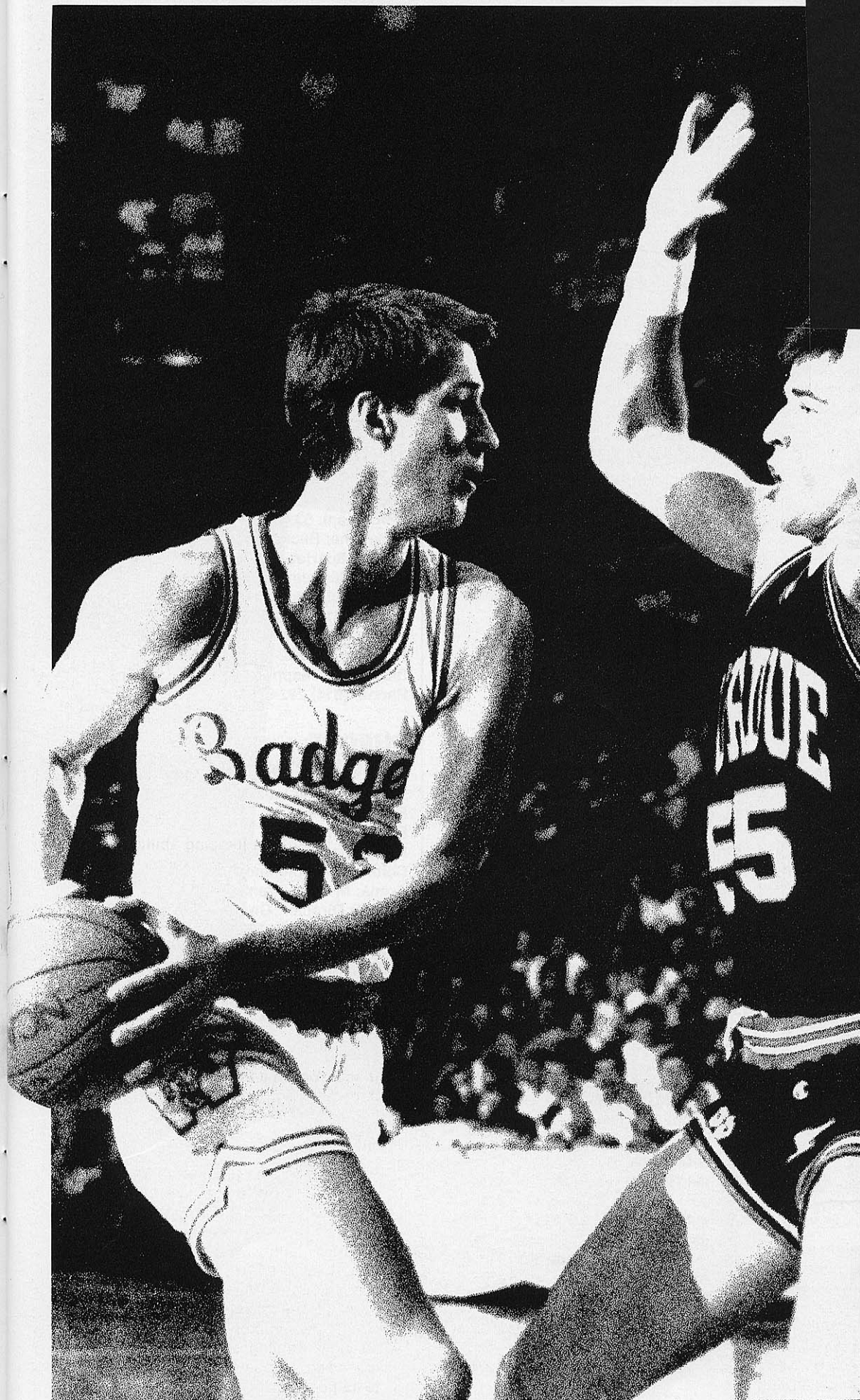
be in regards to jumping ability, strength, speed, quickness and stamina."

Open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm five days per week, Camp Randall's 4,000 square foot Wisconsin weight room contains some of the finest training equipment on the market today. Hyne points to 38,000 pounds of free weight, 21 olympic bars, 21 free-weight stations, seven squat stations (of which four are electric squat racks), 10 bench press stations, four wall-pully cable stations, five pieces of Kelser equipment (based on pneumatic pressure and used especially for high-speed training), and two full set dumbbells (5-100 pounds, in five-pound increments).

In addition to the weight room in Camp Randall, the basketball team has a weight room in the UW Fieldhouse available for use during practice sessions.

And the newly opened Dave McClain Athletic Facility houses an 8,500 square foot state-of-the-art, computerized weight room. Along with all new training equipment is a separate computer room for evaluating athletes, a maintenance room, strength training offices, and a glass-enclosed conference area with seating for 10 to 15 people.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR A.L. 'ADE' SPONBERG



A new era of University of Wisconsin athletics began in 1987 as the school welcomed Athletic Director A.L. "Ade" Sponberg.

Sponberg was named the UW's athletic director on May 15, 1987 and thus marks the second year at the helm of the Wisconsin athletic program in 1988-89. He succeeded Elroy "Crazylegs" Hirsch, who served 18 successful years at the helm before announcing his retirement.

Sponberg has made an immediate impact on the Wisconsin athletic scene. He has been instrumental in instituting a comprehensive marketing program for the athletic department and has made the "business" side of the program a top priority. He has been a key figure in the addition of the Dave McClain Athletic Facility to the department and has been on a seemingly non-stop "meet the public" crusade since first coming to Madison.

The 51-year-old Sponberg assumed his duties at Wisconsin on July 1, 1987. He has nearly 22 years of experience as a collegiate athletic director, including a most recent tenure at North Dakota State University from 1973-87. In addition to his AD's position at NDSU, Sponberg also held the rank of professor and chaired the Division of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Athletics.

The athletic program at NDSU enjoyed a highly successful period under Sponberg's leadership. From 1982-85, North Dakota State was the all-sports champion of the North Central Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, the school's football team won NCAA Division II national championships in 1983, 1985 and 1986, and the men's and women's basketball teams as well as the women's volleyball team all reached the NCAA Division II playoffs.

Among the football coaches Sponberg hired while athletic director at North Dakota State were Jim Wacker, now head coach at Texas Christian University, and current Wisconsin head coach Don Morton.

Prior to his period of service at NDSU, Ade was athletic director at Augustana College in Sioux Falls, South Dakota from 1968-73.

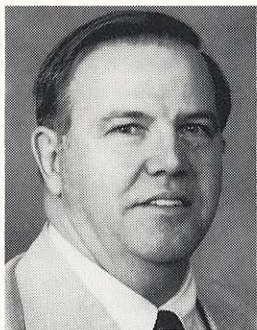
He has also been heavily involved in NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association) governance and policymaking throughout his distinguished career as an administrator. At the time of his hiring at Wisconsin in the Spring of 1987, Ade was a member of the NCAA Council, and was NCAA Division II vice-president. He also served as an NCAA Administrative Committee member from 1984-86. Since 1976, Ade has served on nine other NCAA committees, dealing with such issues as recruiting, legislation and interpretation, television and eligibility.

Ade's academic background is impressive as well. He earned a Ph.D. in Physical Education and Athletic Administration from the University of Michigan in 1968, received a master's degree in Physical Education from Mankato State University in 1963, and earned a bachelor's degree in Physical Education from Gustavus Adolphus College in 1958.

He and his wife, Donna, have two children - Steve, 30, and Kari, 28.

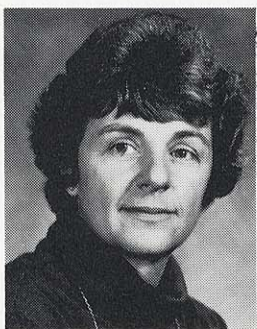
Prior to his arrival at Wisconsin, Neale had an eight-year tenure as Superintendent of the Middleton-Cross Plains area, Wisconsin School District.

Duane Kleven is in his fifth year as an assistant athletic director for Men's Varsity Sports with the University of Wisconsin Athletic Department. He assumed his position on April 1, 1984.

A native of Stoughton, Wisconsin, Duane is a 1961 graduate of the University of Wisconsin with a Bachelor's degree in Physical Education. He also earned his Master's degree in Physical Education from the UW in 1963.

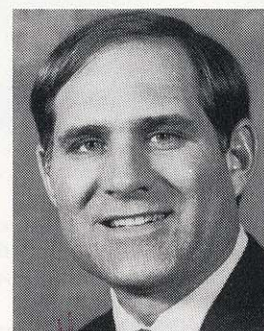
Kleven was a successful wrestling coach for 13 years, and revitalized the Wisconsin wrestling program in the 1970s.

ROGER SCHUSTER

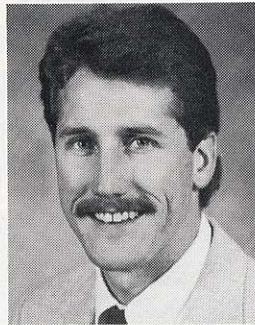
Facility Coordinator

Strength & Conditioning Coach

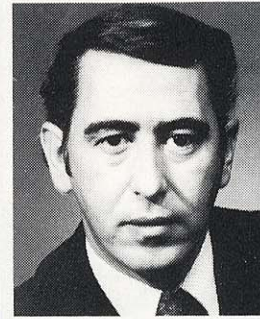

ACADEMIC STAFF

"The goal of our staff is to provide an atmosphere in which each young man or woman can develop fully — as a person, as a student and as an athlete."

Academic excellence is emphasized at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Wisconsin athletes must be given to the counseling system available to the student athletes.

Three full-time staff members — Assistant Athletic Director **Dr. Diane Johnson** and counselors **Alan Zussman** and **Mary Weaver** — conduct the Wisconsin Student Affairs program offered to the nearly 900 Badger athletes. As former members of the academic dean's office, Alan and Diane have a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin and a permanent line of communication with all University departments.

For those athletes who do request assistance, Diane, Alan and Mary offer counseling sessions on a one-to-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin

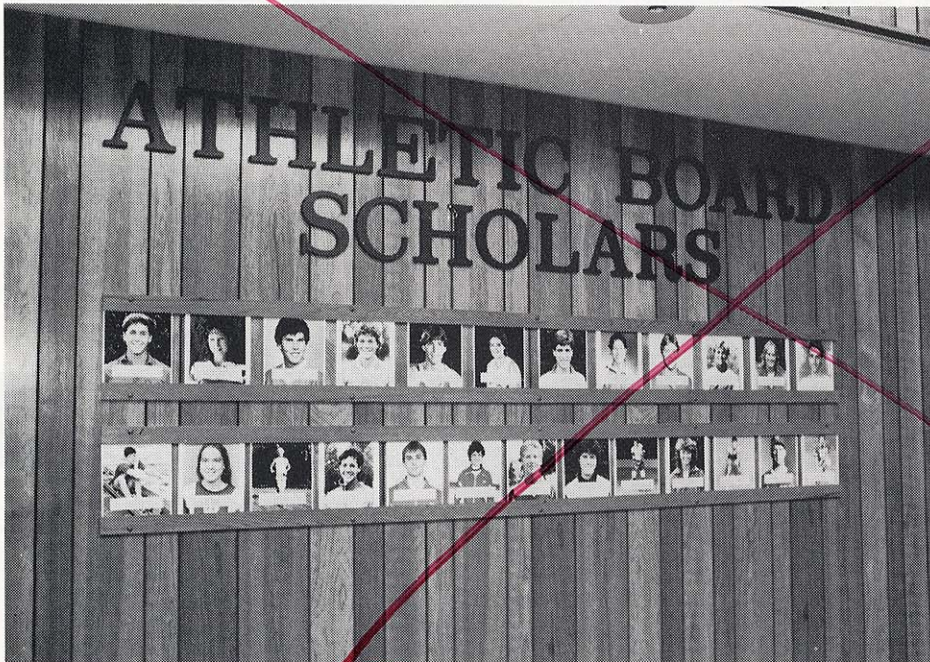

Athletic Board Scholars are letter winners who have the highest grade point averages in their respective sports. The honor, begun in 1987, is awarded annually by the UW Athletic Board.

The 1987-88 school year proved to be another in a long line of success for University of Wisconsin athletes in the classroom.

- Don Davey (football) earned GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American first team honors.
- Tom Senn (men's swimming) was voted to the second GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American At-Large team.

Of the 1,042 men and women student-athletes - representing 25 sports - registered last fall, 323 (31%) recorded a B (3.00 on a 4.00 scale) or better. A total of 98 student-athletes were named to Dean's lists in their respective colleges.

Four athletes achieved a 4.00 GPA, or straight A's — Robert Waite (men's tennis), and James Almquist, Jerome Ebert and John Hill (men's crew).

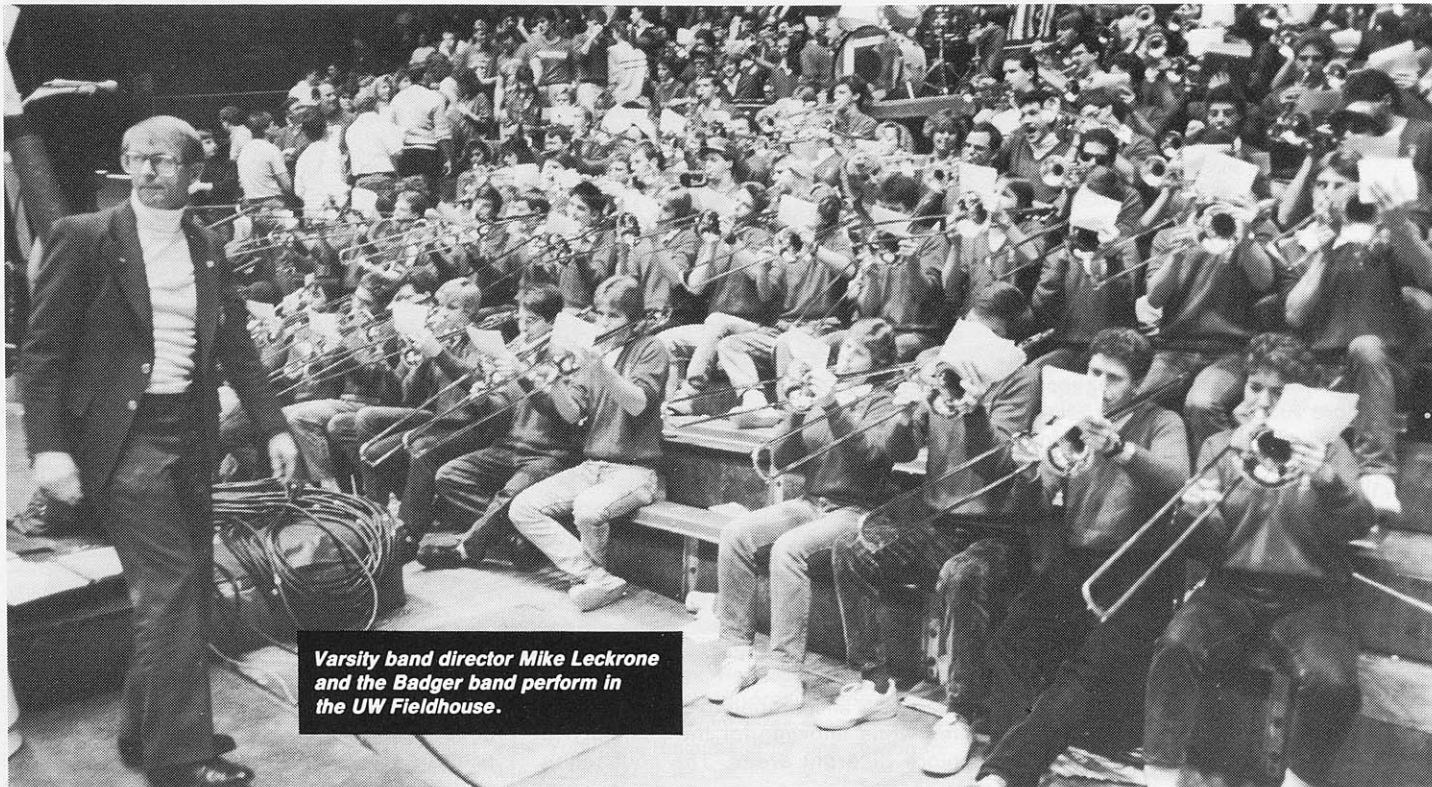
This marked the 13th consecutive semester at the UW that at least 31% of the school's student-athletes achieved such excellent classroom results.

Forty-four male student-athletes at the University of Wisconsin, including Rob Willey of the basketball team, earned Big Ten All-Academic honors in 1987-88 along with 34 female student-athletes.

Since 1979, seven University athletes have received the prestigious NCAA post-graduate scholarship award - an achievement unparalleled among Division I institutions.

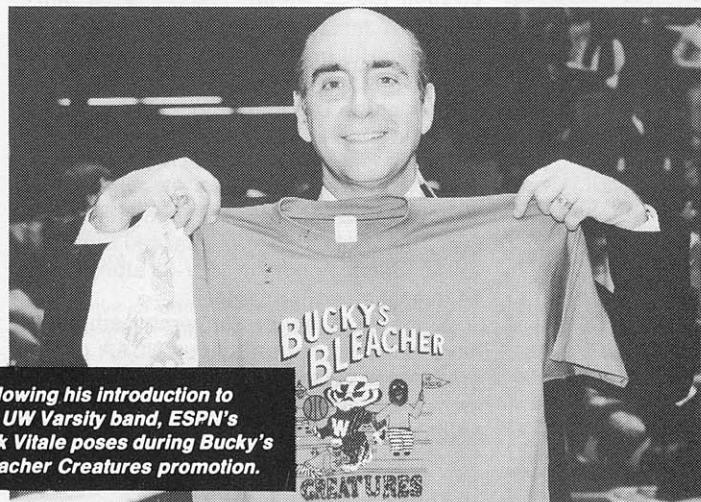

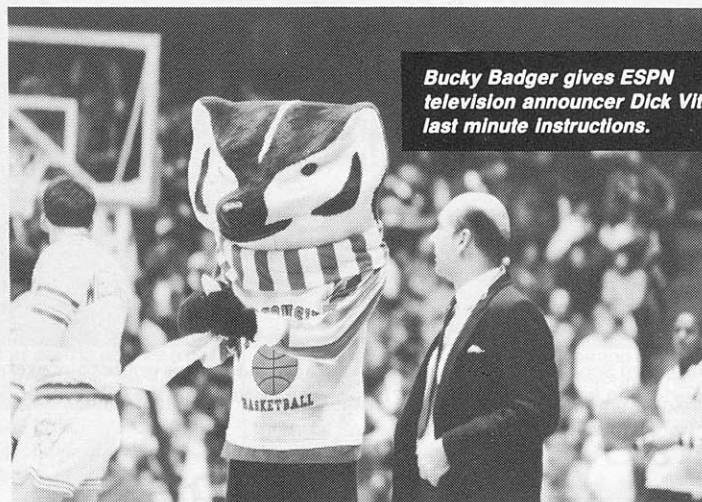
Besides playing at athletic events, this versatile group of musicians give various concerts around the state during the Spring semester.

BADGERS ENJOY SUCCESSFUL SUMMER TOUR

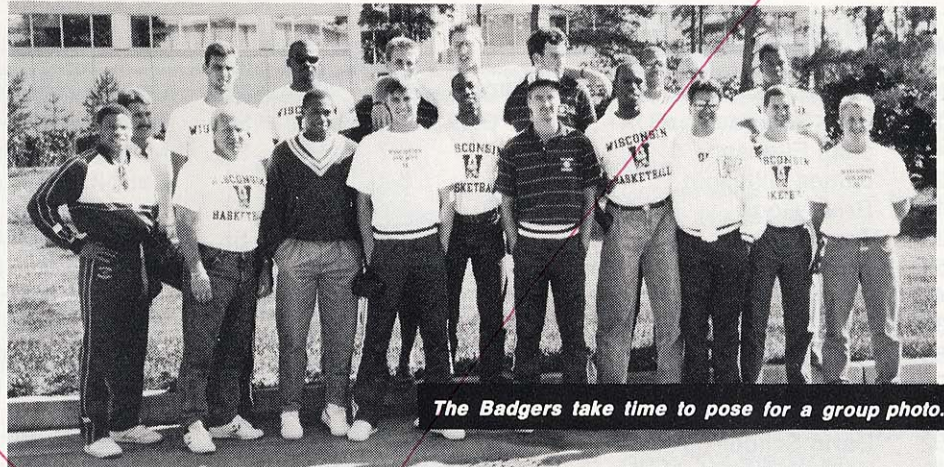

"When you take a trip like ours, you don't really expect to win all eight games," Yoder said. "But it was worth every penny. I think we're really going to see some benefits from it down the road."

something to think about in the final game of the trip. He scored 53 points to lead the UW to a 120-118 victory over Taby of Sodertalje, Sweden's national champion. Wisconsin overcame a 12-point deficit in the last four minutes.

"We discovered two things on the trip," Yoder said. "With the wide lane in the international game, Jones learned he can score farther away from the basket. The trip also showed our players that Jones needs to get the ball in his hands as much as possible."

Jones made 22 of 27 field goal attempts and was virtually unstoppable against Sweden's national champions. His performance overshadowed **TRENT JACKSON** who was also in double figures with 34 points. Jackson made 14 of 17 field goals and **TOM MOLASKI** handed out 10 assists.

Wisconsin began the trip by crushing a club team from Halsingborg, Sweden, 104-53 on August 11. The Badgers defeated the Denmark National Team, 75-68, in the first of two games. They completed the two-game sweep with a 77-58 victory on August 14.

The Badgers reached the half-way point of their tour by posting a 94-65 victory over HMNKY, Finland's National Team, on

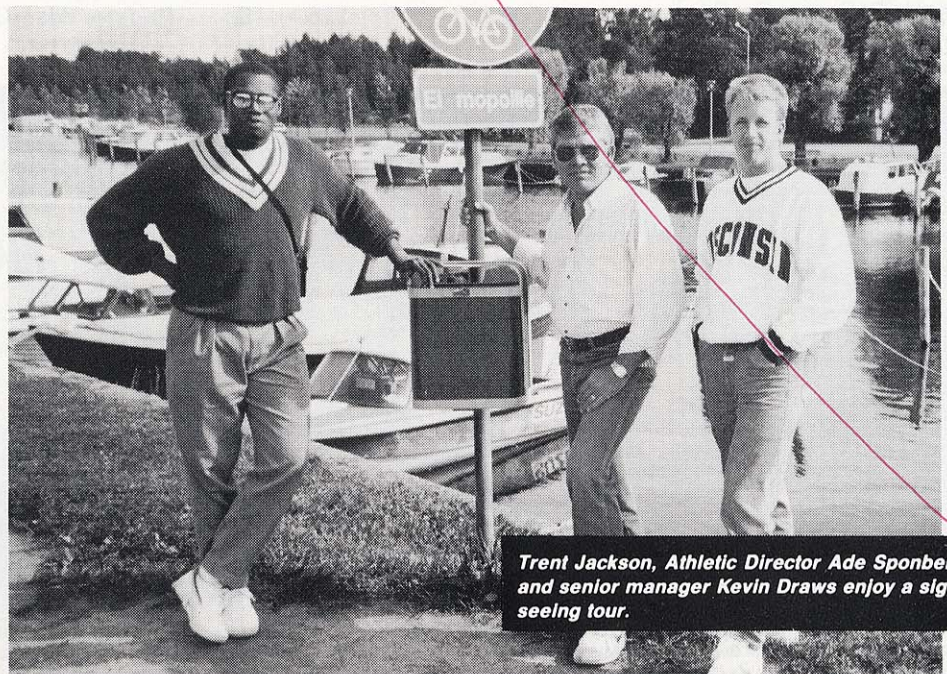
August 16. Jackson turned in a dazzling performance with a game-high 26 points on 11 of 14 shooting and a game-high six steals.

Jones and **DARIN SCHUBRING** scored 20 and 19 points, respectively, in a 95-62 rout of Fokopo, a club team from Forssa, Finland. The Badgers ended their tour of Finland with an 88-74 victory over Uudenkaupungin on August 20.

TIM LOCUM scored 21 points to lead six Badgers in double figures in a 91-55 rout of a club team from Solna, Sweden on August 21.

The Badgers shot 63 percent from the field during the tour and made 51 of 63 shots in the final game (.810).

"This was a great learning experience for us as well as a great life experience," Yoder said. "But a true evaluation of the trip won't be available until our regular season begins in November. Then we'll see how much we learned."

90 YEARS OF WISCONSIN BASKETBALL

Dec. 1898 — Six years after the advent of the new sport of basketball, five young men who learned to play the sport at the Milwaukee Y.M.C.A. form a team at Wisconsin. Bob Burdick, John Mapel, Carl Stillman, Paul Stover, and Captain Walter Hirschberg make up the first Wisconsin Badger basketball team. Dr. J.C. Elsom is the first UW coach.

Jan. 21, 1899 — Wisconsin plays its first game ever and is bested by the Milwaukee Normal Alumni, 25-15 in Milwaukee.

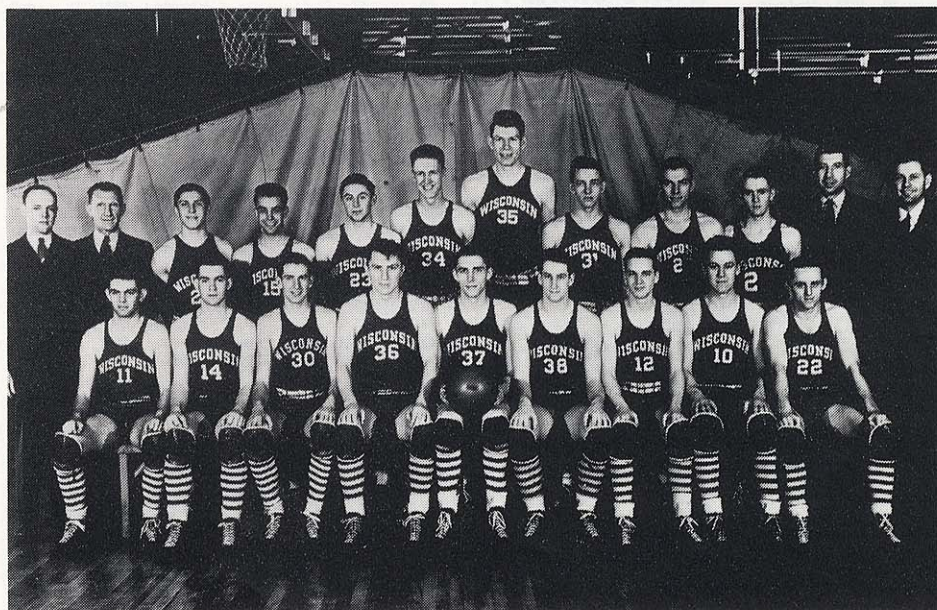
Mar. 4, 1899 — The Badgers play their first home game, again against the Milwaukee Normal Alumni. This time Wisconsin plays much better, but is edged 13-10. The inaugural season record is 0-3.

Feb. 15, 1900 — A 25-15 defeat of Wayland Academy gives Wisconsin its first victory since the sports' inception.

Mar. 1902 — After completing a 10-game schedule — all on the road — the Badgers finish the year with a 7-3 mark, their first winning season.

Dec. 2, 1904 — Emmett Angell coaches the Badgers for the first time and watches his team drub Sparta's Company C, 75-10. Christian Steinmetz scores 50 points in the game to set a pre-modern single game scoring record.

Jan. 1905 — The Wisconsin basketball team makes its first road trip east. The Badgers finish the eastern swing of New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Ohio at 2-6.

Spring, 1905 — Christian Steinmetz finishes the season with 462 points, setting a Wisconsin single-season scoring mark that would stand for 61 years. Steinmetz is later named the Badgers' first All-American.

Mar. 15, 1907 — Wisconsin outscores Purdue, 37-10 to secure an 11-3 record and a share of the Big Ten championship.

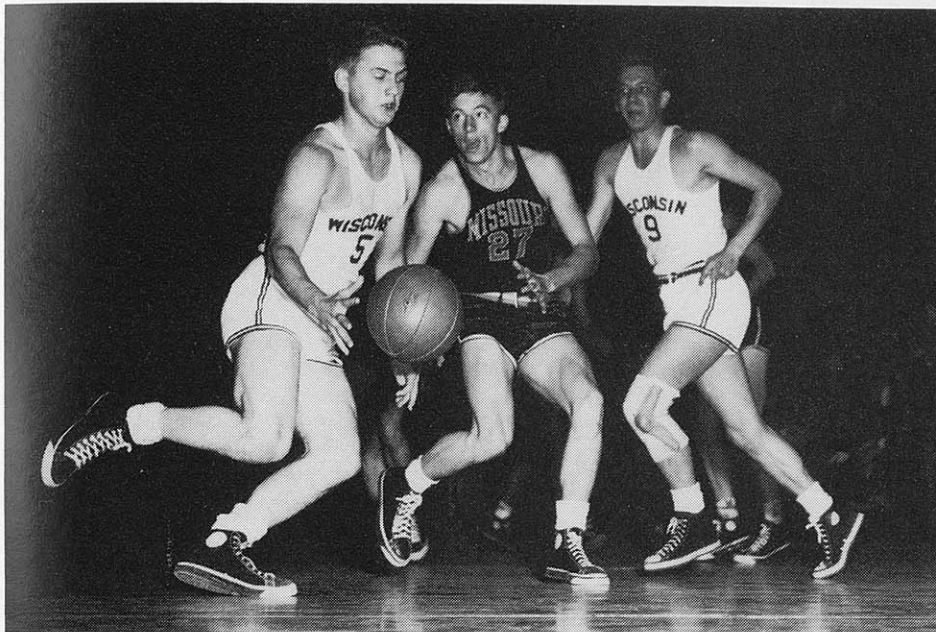
Mar. 16, 1912 — First year coach Walter Meanwell's team drops Indiana, 32-21 to complete an undefeated season at 15-0. Wisconsin wins the Big Ten title outright and will win or share that distinction seven more times before Meanwell is through coaching in 1934.

Mar. 16, 1918 — Despite dropping a 19-11 decision to Minnesota, first-year coach Guy Lowman's Badgers win the school's sixth Big Ten Championship in 12 years.

Fall, 1934 — Harold "Bud" Foster, a former all-American player with the Badgers, takes over as their head coach. Foster will hold that position for 25 years, longer than any other basketball coach in the history of the school.

Spring, 1935 — In his first year as head coach, Harold "Bud" Foster leads Wisconsin to the Big Ten title, posting a 15-5 record.

Mar. 29, 1941 — The "Cinderella" Badgers, lower division Big Ten finishers only one year before, top Washington State, 39-34 in the championship game of the NCAA

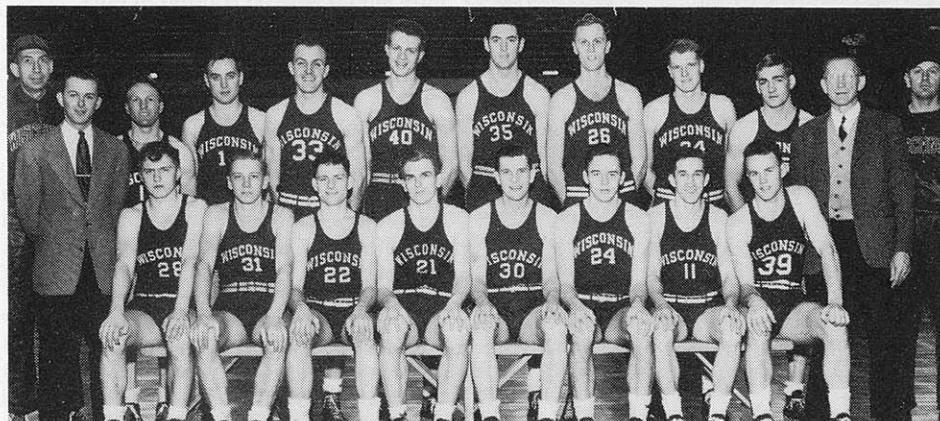


Bob Mader controls the basketball in game against Missouri with Larry Pokrzywinski moving into flow of the offense.

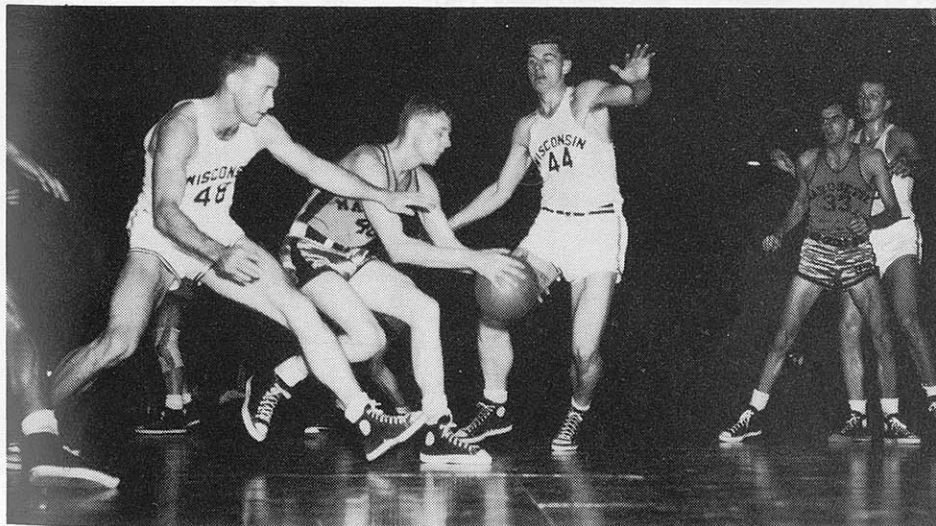
tournament. John Kotz is named MVP of the tourney. The Badgers' captain, Gene Englund, is the Big Ten MVP and receives All-American accolades.

Spring, 1942 — For the second consecutive year a Badger is named the conference MVP and all-American. Sharp-shooting John Kotz earns those honors this season.

Mar., 1947 — The 15-5 Big Ten Champion Badgers are invited to play in the NCAA Eastern regionals in New York's Madison Square Garden. Wisconsin takes third place in the East by squeaking past Navy, 50-49 after losing the opener, 70-56 to C.C.N.Y. The conference championship and NCAA tournament bid stand as the last in Badger history.

Feb. 28, 1949 — Junior Don Rehfeldt takes 37 shots in a 70-47 trouncing of Iowa. The 37 shots stands as a Wisconsin single game record to the present.

Spring, 1950 — After being named the Big Ten's MVP, Don Rehfeldt becomes Wisconsin's last All-American to date. Rehfeldt finishes his career as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1169 points.

Jan. 3, 1953 — Center Paul Morrow, in a 50-46 topping of Purdue, pulls down 30 rebounds in the contest — an all-time Badger best.

Mar. 11, 1963 — At the 40th annual Gyro Club banquet, senior Ken Siebel is named the team's MVP for the third straight year. This is the only time a Wisconsin player has earned that distinction three times.

Mar. 11, 1967 — With 12 seconds remaining in the last game of the year, sophomore Chuck Nagle makes a lay-up to tie Christian Steinmetz for the team single season scoring record of 462, set in 1904-

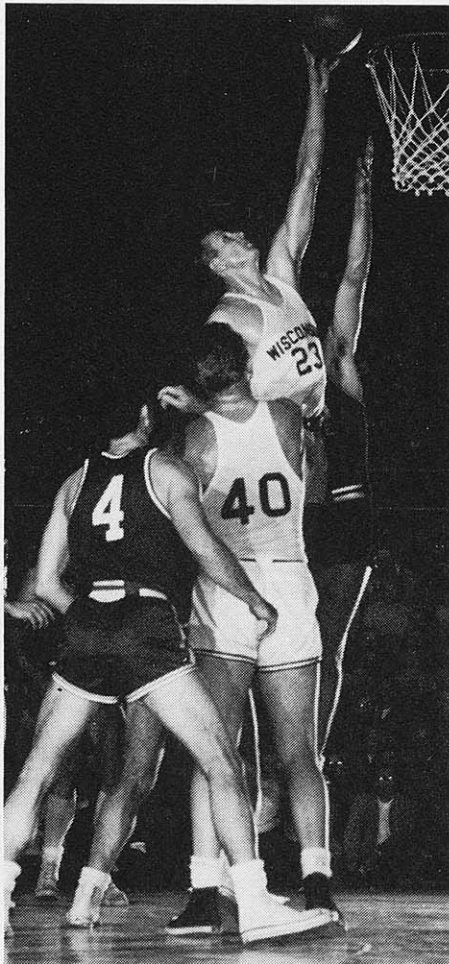
05. Nagle was fouled on the play, and makes the free throw to set a new record of 463.

Mar. 2, 1968 — Senior Joe Franklin pulls down a career-high 27 rebounds in a 104-84 victory over Purdue in his final game in the Fieldhouse. Franklin ends his collegiate career one week later having amassed 858 boards in his three seasons with the Badgers, giving him a school best average of 286 per year.

Spring, 1968 — Only one year after Chuck Nagle broke a single-season scoring record that stood for 62 years, senior Joe Franklin shatters the record, scoring 544 points in the 1967-68 season.

Spring, 1971 — Senior co-captain Clarence Sherrod scores 570 points in his final season as a Badger to take Wisconsin all-time single season scoring honors.

Mar. 3, 1979 — Facing eventual NCAA champion Michigan State in the regular season finale, Wisconsin's Wesley Matthews hits a shot from behind the half-court line as time expires to win, 83-81.

Dec. 30, 1979 — In the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, HI, the Badgers connect on 32 of 43 field goal attempts (.744), setting a school record and defeating Army, 78-54.

Mar. 10, 1981 — Claude Gregory scores 29 points and grabs 17 rebounds in his last game in the Cardinal and White. Gregory leaves Wisconsin as its all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 1745 and 904, respectively.

Dec. 2, 1985 — In a non-conference matchup with San Francisco State, senior Rick Olson makes 17 field goals en route to a 90-61 victory. Olson's 17 made field goals

tops the previous record of 16, set almost 27 years before by Bob Litzow.

Mar. 9, 1986 — Setting a school record by starting every game in a four-year career (112), Rick Olson guides Wisconsin past Northwestern, 70-68. Olson scores 26 points in the contest and misses becoming the Badger's career scoring leader by only ten points. Olson does, however, set the record for points scored in a single season, finishing the 1985-86 campaign with 571 points.

Mar. 8, 1987 — Mike Heineman scores 20 points, grabs seven rebounds and hands out nine assists in his final game as a Badger. Heineman ends his career as Wisconsin's all-time leader in assists in all games (388) and in Big Ten play-only (248).

Aug. 21, 1988 — Danny Jones scores 53 points to lead the UW to a 120-118 victory over Taby of Sodertalje, Sweden's national champion. The Badgers ended their two-week tour of Denmark, Finland and Norway with an 8-0 record.
