System of Numbering.

The system of numbering in use provides for a number for every twenty feet of street frontage, odd numbers being on the left hand and even numbers on the right, when going in the direction of increasing numbers. Numbers increase from the river, both north and south; and from the east to the west city line. On the north of the river, 600 is at the line of College Avenue; the numbers increasing northward and decreasing southward from that point. By this system it is always possible to locate a house, while traveling another street, as the number must always occupy the same relative position on every parallel street. If, for example, you want to find 1200 Spencer, and are traveling College Avenue, you will find that number at about the intersection of Story street, and will know at once that Story is the shortest road to your destination.
