

RESOLUTIONS.

Whereas, the railroads of this country in the year 1908 made a regulation requiring all packages of goods less than carloads to be marked in full with the consignees name and address and whereas, said rule applies to each package of cheese however small and has greatly increased the labor and care of the shippers of cheese and is productive of great injury and loss in that, that said marking publishes to everyone the name and address of customers which every shipper has a right shall be kept private. That no good reason exists for said rule since no losses have occurred by reason of not marking in full:

Therefore be it resolved, that we ask that the regulation requiring cheese to be marked in full be rescinded so far as it applies to cheese shipments for the reason that it is arbitrary, unreasonable and oppressive:

Resolved, that we favor the organization of a county agricultural and dairy school for the better training of our young men in the practice of farming, dairying and cheesemaking.

Whereas, it is evident that this association is of benefit to the people of southern Wisconsin and is worthy of being made a permanent organization:

Therefore be it resolved, that the executive committee be and the same is directed to have the association duly incorporated under the laws of this state under the name of Southern Wisconsin Dairymen's and Cheesemakers' Association.

Whereas, it appears that Congress has been called in

extra session to revise the tariff on imports and we are convinced that the present import tariff on cheese of 6 cents per pound has in a great measure contributed to the great growth and prosperity of our dairy and cheese interests since said tariff went into effect:

Therefore be it resolved, that we are opposed to any decrease in said tariff and we request our Senators and Representatives in Congress to use their best efforts to retain the present tariff.

Resolved, that we are in favor of a tariff commission with power to adjust tariffs as the needs of the country require.

Resolved, that the terms of the directors elected be for three, two and one year respectively in the order of their election and that hereafter there shall be one director elected annually for the term of three years.
