Mrs. Colby was president of the Nebraska State Woman's Suffrage Association sixteen years. Founded the Woman's Tribune in 1883. In March 1888 took it to Washington D. C. to publish it as a daily to report the first International Congress of Women. Afterwards published the Woman's Tribune there until 1904, when she removed to Portland, Oregon.

In 1899 she attended as a delegate the International Council of Women in London, and formed the acquaintance of distinguished suffrage workers, at whose invitation she remained to lecture for some months in England. Mrs. Colby returned to England in 1910 to lecture.

In April she returned to Oregon. She is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin with the degree of Ph. B. and the chair of instructor of Latin and History later in the institution. She began suffrage work as assistants for Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Susan B. Anthony, and Mary A. Livermore.

Mrs. Colby has written intensively, and is an officer in the Woman's National Press Association, The Universal Peace Union and the Woman's Equality Association.
