A number of meetings were held in the territory where an R.E.A. project is being set up during the past year. No definite announcement has been made concerning whether or not the necessary funds will be received.

Meetings were held in other townships where rural lines have been extended by private companies.

Seed Loans

Seed loan applications through the Farm Credit Administration were received at the County Agent's Office. A total of 82 applications were completed. About half of these were approved.

Community Club Activities

Two folk dancing schools were held during the past year as a continuation of this activity that was started last year.

Three community clubs presented plays in the County Drama Festival that was held at New London. The play "Out of the Night" presented by the Bear Creek Community Club represented Waupaca County at the State Drama Festival held in connection with Farm and Home Week at the College of Agriculture last February.
