



The first school in Burlington was the 1840 Whitman School, now a museum.

Burlington Union School District was incorporated by the Wisconsin Legislature in 1857, and a newer school was needed. That was Lincoln school used for both a primary and high school education. A serious quarrel resulted in two school boards being formed. The school was closed for a full year until a new board finally gained control April, 1861.

Newer schools were gradually built and Lincoln unused. But in 1912 it was rebuilt and reopened as a kindergarten and for first and second grades. It now serves as Burlington Area School District Administrative Offices.
